

Serving Missionaries on Home Assignment

When your missionary visits your church on home assignment, here are some tangible ways to encourage them and help them feel connected to your congregation. Mission teams or small groups can assign a different section to different members to spread the encouragement out across the church.

Transportation and Housing

Since many missionaries won't have a car or home in North America, it can be a huge stress to figure out how to get from place to place while on home assignment. From picking them up from the airport to lending your car for a period of time, offering an extra room or connecting missionaries to churches that have a missionary house, transportation and housing are two of the biggest stressors for many home assignment missionaries.

Does your missionary need housing or a car during this time?

Does anyone on your missions committee have, or know of someone who has, an extra car or space to house the missionaries?

Is anyone available to greet your missionaries at the airport?

Time to Share

Stories from the field point to the work God is doing through an ordinary person who said "yes" to His call. Many congregants first hear the call to support overseas work or to go themselves while hearing from other missionaries. Giving missionaries time to share helps the whole congregation connect with the work your church is supporting.

How long will your missionary be in town?

When will the missions team or missions/pastoral staff meet with the missionary?



How does your missionary most like to share about their ministry? (i.e. video, interview, welcome reception)

How does your congregation best connect with ministries? (i.e. video, interview, welcome reception)

What day and through what venue can the missionary share?

If your missionary is in town for longer than one Sunday, invite them to join a small group or Sunday school class to connect with friends new and old and get poured into during this time at home. Many missionaries share how it is nice to worship and learn in their heart language during home assignment.

How can we make sure their kids feel welcome?
