# WHAT IS AN INTERNATIONAL CHURCH?

International churches are church bodies outside of North America that typically serve expatriates, or those living outside their home countries. For this reason, international churches are often **multicultural** and **multinational**.

**Multicultural** — Multiple cultures and ethnic groups represented in the church body

**Multinational** — Made up of members from many countries and nations



While international churches can take different forms, many communicate in English, are non-denominational, and designed to serve a broad, global audience. Their very structure reflects the diversity of the people they serve.

These churches are also typically recognized by the governments of their host countries. In some places, that recognition creates a remarkable reality: even where local Christians may face restrictions, expatriates are permitted to gather freely.

**The result is a visible, functioning Christian presence in places that might otherwise be closed.**

International churches are not easy places to serve. The very characteristics that define them (the diversity, the constant movement, the complexity of cultures and expectations) can stretch leaders and congregations alike.
